Some of the ways that we as a community seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbor as ourselves include our current outreach ministries:

**The Beaverton Behavioral Health Court:** The Behavioral Health Court provides opportunities for people living with mental illness to find stability, engage in treatment, and access services and resources that support recovery. We support participants in this program by providing a monthly meal, conversation, and encouragement.

**Safe Parking:** We currently host four guest vehicles through our Safe Parking ministry. Guests have access to the church during office hours, including the kitchen, bathrooms, library/hearth room, and sanctuary.

**Beaverton Police Partnership:** We partner with the Beaverton Police to provide warm clothing for distribution to some of our most vulnerable neighbors.

**Assistance Bags:** We assemble and distribute hundreds of bags filled with food and beverages for neighbors in need.

**Rebuilding Together Washington County:** Each year, a St. Bart's team joins this effort to help low-income homeowners with essential home repairs.

**Beaverton Resource Center:** We partner with the Beaverton Resource Center to help meet the needs of our neighbors. Services include food assistance, financial aid, health and wellness support, family support, and employment resources.

**Classical Up Close:** We host and support this special opportunity to experience free concerts by world-class musicians from the Oregon Symphony and their friends.

**Pride Beaverton:** 2026 will mark our second year hosting a welcome booth at Beaverton Pride.

**THE FIRST LESSON**

*Acts 17:22-31*

Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, “Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, ‘To an unknown god.’ What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For ‘In him we live and move and have our being’; as even some of your own poets have said,

‘For we too are his offspring.’

Since we are God’s offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead.”

**THE SECOND LESSON***1 Peter 3:13-22*

Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you-- not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.


