Some of the ways that we as a community seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbor as ourselves include our current outreach ministries:

The Beaverton Behavioral Health Court: The Behavioral Health Court provides opportunities for people living with mental illness to find stability, engage in treatment, and access services and resources that support recovery. We support participants in this program by providing a monthly meal, conversation, and encouragement.

Safe Parking: We currently host four guest vehicles through our Safe Parking ministry. Guests have access to the church during office hours, including the kitchen, bathrooms, library/hearth room, and sanctuary.

Beaverton Police Partnership: We partner with the Beaverton Police to provide warm clothing for distribution to some of our most vulnerable neighbors.

Assistance Bags: We assemble and distribute hundreds of bags filled with food and beverages for neighbors in need.

Rebuilding Together Washington County: Each year, a St. Bart's team joins this effort to help low-income homeowners with essential home repairs.

Beaverton Resource Center: We partner with the Beaverton Resource Center to help meet the needs of our neighbors. Services include food assistance, financial aid, health and wellness support, family support, and employment resources.

Classical Up Close: We host and support this special opportunity to experience free concerts by world-class musicians from the Oregon Symphony and their friends.

Pride Beaverton: 2026 will mark our second year hosting a welcome booth at Beaverton Pride.

THE FIRST LESSON

Acts 1:6-14

When the apostles had come together, they asked Jesus, “Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?” He replied, “It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? 
IT IS RIGHT, AND A GOOD AND JOYFUL THING always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth;

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.


